

January 2020 Primate's Message of the Feast of the Nativity & Theophany **January 6, 2020**

EMMANUEL - GOD IS WITH US!

The significance of Christmas is embedded in this simple affirmation. As we celebrate the miraculous birth of Christ, we become more cognizant of God's perpetual presence in our lives. With the birth of Baby Jesus, God himself visits the human race, embarking on His earthly redemptive mission. God becomes incarnate to dwell with us, to give us spiritual birth so that we may align our paths and live according to His commandments and personal examples.

When we celebrate the Nativity and Theophany of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, first and foremost, we confess His divine intervention and lasting presence in our lives. We proclaim that God is with us and therefore, with that conviction, we direct our lives toward the good and the beautiful, toward divine perfection and creativity.

When we reflect on God's presence in our lives, we experience a revelation and a spiritual rebirth, which in turn fill our lives with new resolutions, commitments and visions.

Engulfed in the spirit of New Year and Christmas, as a spiritual servant of the Holy Armenian Apostolic Mother Church, I pray to God, beseeching that He transforms our hearts and makes them a warm manger for the newborn King to abide. In our prayer, we recall the words of St. Nersess the Graceful found in the Service of Peace Hour, where he says, "And a child is born, a son has been given to us, for God is with us. And his authority is upon his shoulders, for God is with us. And his name is called messenger of great counsel, for God is with us. And wonderful counselor, for God is with us. And God the mighty prince, for God is with us. And prince of peace Father of the One to come, the Lord God is with us."





Shadows of 1915 Book Review

The St. Vartan Cultural Committee welcomed author Jerry Burger to discuss his first and recently published novel "The Shadows of 1915" on December 8, 2019. Burger was born and raised in Fresno, California, and although he did not grow up on a farm, as a teenager he would make some money by picking grapes at the end of the summer. He had many Armenian friends as a boy. There were two things about Armenians that really stood out to him. The first was that every Armenian family had their own story tied to the Armenian Genocide, and the second was that they had intense and very strong negative feelings toward Turks. He found the

aftermath of the Armenian Genocide to be a compelling topic through which he could explore issues related to family and justice.

Burger's book examines how the legacy of the Armenian Genocide affects the life of the descendants of the survivors. The story takes place in Central California in 1953, where Armenian immigrants and their families live one generation removed from the 1915 murder of more than one million Armenians at the hands of the Turkish government. An encounter between the sons of a genocide survivor and some Turkish college students forces each of the main characters to make difficult decisions that pit loyalty to family and community against person-

al and legal standards of right and wrong. It delves into questions such as: How long is the shadow of genocide? How does it affect the offspring of the survivors? And how do survivors and their families retain a belief in justice when atrocities go unpunished? These are some of the questions addressed in Jerry Burger's novel

It is a story about a displaced group of people and the consequences of real historic events that have rarely been examined in fiction. It is also a story about culture, family, recovery from tragedy, and the nature of justice.

We were fortunate to have Kim Bardakian conduct an interview with Jerry about his book, which kept things lively and interesting. Excerpts from the book were read and discussed, and the audience got a glimpse into the life of Armenian families in Fresno during the 1950's. Many audience members recalled certain elements of life in Fresno during the period of the story and had lively conversations with Burger following the presentation. The story is a good read and quite insightful.
